Entry to Australian National Maritime Museum including the below listed tours and experiences (when available):
Attraction opens 10:30am-4pm, last boarding time for vessels at 3:10pm, closed on Christmas Day 25 December.

1. Permanent galleries and all temporary exhibitions

3. The vessels, including the HMAS Vampire, tall ship James Craig 1874 (when in port), tall ship HMB Endeavour replica (when in port), Duyfken(replica) - the first European Tall Ship launched in Australia 1606.

5. The 3D Cinema (when open)
6. Under-5s play zone (when open)

- Please note: HMAS Vampire only top deck open, HMB Endeavour replica only top deck open and James Craig 1874 is currently closed.
- The availability of guided tours will be assessed on a daily basis and be limited to a maximum of 10 visitors. They will run at a reduced frequency while COVID-19 restrictions are in place.

How to get there

• By Car

Closest Parking:

- Harbourside Car Park (Address: 100 Murray Street, Pyrmont), approximately 2 minutes walk
- Parking fees apply

• By Train

Train to Town Hall station and walk across Pyrmont Bridge

• By Bus

Bus 389 from North Bondi, via Bondi Junction and Town Hall, set down at Museum entrance

• By Ferry

Sydney Ferries' services to Pyrmont Bay Wharf depart from Circular Quay Wharf 5 about every half an hour. Please check NSW Transport Info for a full schedule, on 131 500 or www.transportnsw.info

• By Light Rail

Pyrmont Bay station, 2 min walk or The Star station, 5 min walk.

What to bring/wear

- Comfortable enclosed, flat and comfortable walking shoes. High heels are not permitted on the museum's vessels. Open-toed shoes, sandals and thongs are discouraged.
- Protective clothing, hat, sunscreen lotion, and sunglasses

Other info

- Adults are not permitted to carry infants and children in arms on the vessels for personal safety reasons.
- Smoking, food, beverages and videography are not permitted on board any vessel or in the lighthouse.
- Photography and cameras are permitted on board vessels and in the lighthouse.
- Large bags should be deposited at the Museum's cloakroom before boarding or visiting the lighthouse and vessels. Cloakroom service is provided free of charge.
- Children must be at least 90cm in height to board HMB Endeavour replica, submarine HMAS Onslow and some visiting vessels (ask at the ticket desk regarding visiting vessels upon arrival).
- Children 12 years and under must be accompanied by an adult when boarding the vessels.
- Last boarding times and vessel availability are subject to change without notice
- Sometimes the Museum may need to temporarily close areas/vessels for maintenance, improvements or safety reasons. Please check with the Museum for updated information before travel.
- For visitor safety, when the temperature reaches 36° Celsius all vessels will be closed. If it looks like a it's going to be a hot day, come early and see the vessels first. Check with the Museum friendly staff if you're unsure. If extreme wet weather hits, all vessels will be closed for visitor safety. If it's looking like a rainy day, check with the Museum staff. There's still lots of amazing things to enjoy inside the museum though, so don't let rain stop you from visiting!
- Movies showing at the 3D cinema are related to and depend on the exhibitions currently available at the Museum. Please check the Museum's website for up-to-date information

The Australian National Maritime Museum is Australia's national centre for maritime collections, exhibitions, research and archaeology. The museum presents a changing program of stimulating exhibitions and events to share Australia's maritime history and connect the stories, objects, people and places that are part of the country's narrative. The Museum welcomes over 850,000 visitors annually including families, interstate and international tourists. Over 13,000 members support the museum and regularly enjoy special events and activities.

The knowledgeable guides will help you unearth the stories of Australia's maritime past and present, bringing to life the stories behind the many fascinating objects housed around the museum and on the spectacular vessels. A range of tours are on offer to suit all ages, interests and amount of time you have free to explore. However, tours are subject to availability so make sure to check what's available when you arrive at the museum so you don't miss out.

- **Behind the Scenes**

Learn about the changing history of Darling Harbour, see the conservation laboratory, ship model workshop and marvel at the large open plan storage spaces which house over 100,000 objects rarely seen on public display.

This is an exciting chance to hear from expert guides about the inner workings of the Sydney Heritage Fleet and the Australian National Maritime Museum.

Enjoy this truly unique opportunity to explore a real ex-navy destroyer and find out about the lives of the sailors who worked aboard this ship in a fascinating 45-minute tour.

Action Stations

Action Stations is an exciting new way to experience the compelling history of the Royal Australian Navy (RAN). Explore the danger and drama of military life at sea through a hi-tech and immersive journey that shows the inner workings of the Navy like never before. This exhibition reinterprets and enlivens our much-loved ex-RAN vessels: HMAS Vampire (Daring class destroyer) HMAS Onslow (Oberon class submarine) and HMAS Advance (Attack class patrol boat).

Please note: HMAS Onslow, HMAS Advance and below deck on HMAS Vampire are temporarily closed due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Vessels (*Vessel availability may change due to COVID-19 restrictions*)

Climb aboard! Exploring one of the largest, most diverse museum fleets anywhere in the world is an unforgettable experience.

NOTE: Children must be taller than 90cm to go onboard the vessels. On hot days to ensure visitor safety, we close all vessels when the temperature reaches 36° Celsius.

- **Duyfken**

A stunning replica of the first European ship to reach Australia in 1606.

- **HMAS Onslow**

Venture into the secret world of submarine warfare on HMAS Onslow.

- Destroyer: **HMAS Vampire (Top Deck Open)**

HMAS Vampire, Australia's largest museum vessel, is the last of the country's big gun ships.

- Patrol Boat: **HMAS Advance (Closed)**

Commissioned in 1968, the hardworking patrol boat HMAS Advance served out of Darwin until 1977

- Tall Ship: **HMB Endeavour (Top Deck Open)**

The Australian-built replica of James Cook's HMB Endeavour is one of the world's most accurate maritime replica vessels.

- One of the finest Edwardian steam yachts: **SY Ena**

Be transported into the luxury of a bygone age aboard Edwardian Steam Yacht Ena.

- Tall Ship: **James Craig 1874 (Closed)**

Come aboard the James Craig – a true restoration of a majestic tall ship (not a replica). One of only four remaining, working 19th century barques in existence.

Kids on Deck Activity Space

Play, create and discover in Kids on Deck - a fun filled activity space with art making and experiments for primary school aged children and their carers.

Under 5s Play Gallery

Children will take an imaginative journey from the 'sandy seashore' to 'under the sea' with free-play games, activities and displays specially designed to stimulate growing minds and inspire curiosity.

Created to meet the needs of our youngest learners, it's an exciting new addition to the museum's offering for families and young children. Kids and carers alike will enjoy a mix of modern equipment and toys (as well as timeless favourites!) that help develop literacy, numeracy, spatial awareness, and movement skills.

3D Cinema

The curated program of ocean and nature-inspired movies from internationally-respected filmmakers complement current museum exhibitions. Covering everything from great white sharks, mysterious marine creatures, submersible journeys to the deepest point of the sea and experiencing the flight of soaring migratory birds, these films delight and entertain.
